Stewardship Reflections

11/17/2019

As we approach the end of the liturgical year, our readings offer a sobering reminder that this life is not our ultimate aim, and that God's justice will triumph in the end. Now is the time to get our priorities in right order, putting God first above all else as his faithful stewards.

Our Lord brings home the urgency of right priorities in our Gospel passage from Luke, reminding the people around him who were looking at the temple nearby, "All that you see here — the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." All in this world is passing, our Lord reminds. We must keep our focus on eternity.

Yet, before the eternal bliss of heaven, we should expect to be tried and tested. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name."

Sounds scary. But if you are living a stewardship way of life, there is nothing to fear. You have a plan in place. All you need to do is stick with it. Put our Lord first in your time, with your talents and through your use of treasure. This way of life is not meant to be easy. But Jesus promises it will lead to eternal salvation and the joy of union with Him. "You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Stewardship

Stewardship is defined as the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares them in love of God and neighbor. And when we think about the stewardship way of life and how we are living it we often do so in terms of Time, Talent, and Treasure. But often, we approach this stewardship way of life as if it is Time, Talent, OR Treasure, as if we can pick and choose which of the three we want to do.

We take the approach, "I give so much of my time and talent that I don't need to give of my treasure" or "my time and talent make up for my treasure". But that approach is not stewardship it is selfishness, because the grateful response to God is Time, Talent, AND Treasure. And yes, sometimes people can't afford to tithe as much as others and they can offset their tithe by offering more of their time and talent, but there is still a need to tithe.

Everyone can afford to give a little something on a consistent basis, think of the Widow's Mite (Lk. 21:1-4), even the poorest of the poor among us can give something and the richest of the rich can likely give a little more. So ask yourself, "Are you truly and fully living a Stewardship Way of Life as a grateful response to God?"
