Stewardship Reflection

01/12/2020

Today marks the close of the Christmas season, but before we return to Ordinary Time, we have one more great feast to celebrate — The Baptism of the Lord. Today's feast is a perfect opportunity to consider the privileges and responsibilities we all share as Christian stewards by virtue of our own Baptism.

At the moment of our Baptism we became adopted sons and daughters of God, members of his holy, Catholic Church. Though we may not have realized it, the moment of our Baptism is also the moment we become Christian stewards, disciples of Jesus Christ, tasked with the work of following in His footsteps day by day and sharing the Gospel message with all those around us.

In our second reading from the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter gives us a glimpse of the person of Jesus we should imitate. "He went about doing good and healing all those oppressed by the devil, for God was with him." We must live our lives like Jesus, seeking to do good to everyone we encounter; not just those in our inner circle of family and friends, but everyone in our community since the Father loves us all and Jesus sought out everyone with His saving message.

In the Gospel passage from Matthew, we see yet another aspect of Jesus in action, this time as he humbly stands before John to be baptized by him. What humility and what willingness to unite Himself to us our Lord demonstrates by this act. We can do no less as we live out our daily lives as his disciples.

And when we do strive with all our might to live out our Baptismal call to Christian stewardship, we will experience the deep honor of knowing that our we, too, are God's "beloved" sons and daughters "with whom He is well-pleased."

There have been a lot of people asking why the parish hall has remained locked throughout the day when not in use, well let's be honest, there have been many people complaining and getting upset. The reason is because we have had numerous occasions when people, non-parishioners, have just walked-in off the street and made themselves at home. The most recent incident was the afternoon of Dec. 22nd, when the parish hall had failed to be locked after Masses, and a man went into the kitchen, poured himself a glass of leftover wine that was in the refrigerator, started a pot of coffee, and was preceding to make himself some pancakes. Again, this was not a parishioner or anyone associated with the parish and this is not the first time that someone has done a very similar thing. Back towards the end of the summer, there was a young man in his 20's who had stopped in the parish hall just to play around with the wheel chairs and it was this same young man who also was caught in the kitchen preparing to make pancakes (I guess there's something about pancakes). And the list could go on, but this is the reason we have been keeping the parish hall locked outside when there are no parish events. Is this perhaps inconvenient for some? Most certainly, yes, to include the parish staff. But I do not have the time to run over to the parish hall every time someone is in there who shouldn't be and unless some of you want to volunteer to serve as day-time security guards or you are willing to pay for any damages or to replace the things that may be stolen by these people, then the parish hall will remain locked when not in use.
