Stewardship Bulletin Reflection
January 19, 2020

Today's readings provide clear and inspiring reminders of the most fundamental aspect of our identity — that of servants of our most high and holy God, His modern-day disciples and stewards. John the Baptist recognized the holiness of Jesus and the response due to Him when he encountered Christ in person on the day they met at the Jordan River. His response, which we read in our Gospel passage from St. John was, "Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world... He is the one of whom I said, 'A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'" What a powerful description of our Lord and the place He should rightfully have in each of our lives. He is truly our Savior, the only one who can free us from our sinfulness. We are utterly and completely dependent on His power, love and mercy. Therefore He truly does "rank ahead" of us; he deserves to be first, above all other priorities and plans in our lives. Let us examine our daily lives and encourage our children to do the same. Does the way I spend my time reflect that God comes first? Do prayer and weekly Mass, regular confession and time with my family "rank ahead" of everything else on my calendar? Do I use my talents, skills and energy to serve my family, parish and community in thanksgiving and recognition that God's kingdom ranks ahead of any other goals or ambitions? Do I spend my money and use my material possessions so as to glorify God? Challenge questions, to be sure. But questions worthy of our high calling as Christian stewards offered a glorious mission in service of our Lord and His kingdom. What will our response be?

Vigilance: Security is Everyone's Job

In last week's bulletin, I mentioned a man who had been caught in the parish hall on Dec. 22nd helping himself to items in the kitchen. On the morning of Monday, Jan. 13th he was caught in the sanctuary of the Church (that's up around the altar) suspiciously looking around and was told to leave. The following day, Tuesday, Jan. 14th, a concerned parent who was picking their pre-K child up from school took a picture of this man once again entering the parish hall and alerted us. At which point the police were called and a criminal trespass warning was filed against him (which other places in town have had to do in regards to this man), which states that he will be arrested if he steps foot on our parish grounds again, which includes the entirety of our block. Now hopefully this will prevent this man from trespassing again, but we still need to be vigilant as a parish. The parishioner who informed the parish office of this man's presence in the Church on Monday morning and the parent who reported him on Tuesday did the right thing (thank you both). And this is something that everyone needs to be doing, because the security and safety of our parish and school is everyone's duty. In this spirit, I would ask you to consider how vigilant and security/safety oriented you are? For example, the outside entrance to the parish hall (which of course needs to be open for Mass since it is the only access to the elevator) is a "blind" entrance, meaning that during Mass we cannot see who may be entering/exiting or hanging out around that entrance. We too, need to remember that this same "blind" entrance allows access to the bathrooms. So when your child needs to go to the bathroom during Mass, if it has been your practice to let them go by themselves, then I would highly encourage you to change that practice. I mention all of this not to scare anyone, but to keep you informed, serve as a reminder that we need to be vigilant, and to start the conversation on how we as a parish family can be more security/safety oriented.
