Stewardship Bulletin Reflection
 April 18, 2021 — Third Sunday of Easter

In addition to celebrating all Christ did for us this Easter season, we also are reminded of how His sacrifice impacts our lives. Today's Gospel reminds us that Jesus should be the center of our lives. This passage begins with two disciples realizing Jesus had just appeared to them. We can learn a valuable lesson from these disciples. To recognize Jesus' appearances in our lives, we need to know Him. And the best way to know the Lord is to spend time with Him. It can start with just 10 minutes of quiet prayer a day and increasing that each week. We might begin by reading Scripture, books on the lives of the Saints, or even a decade of the Rosary. Yet the goal should be to carve out time each day, in a quiet space, for just you and the Lord. As the disciples mentioned, they recognized it was Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We, too, can better know the Lord through the sacraments, most especially the Holy Mass. The Eucharist is Jesus Himself — Body, Blood Soul, and Divinity. What better way to grow in intimacy with Christ than to receive Him frequently or to go talk to Him in front of the Blessed Sacrament? As we make Jesus the center of our lives through prayer and the sacraments, we will be able to recognize Him in day-to-day moments. As we are still in the midst of this Easter season, take time to think about what Christ did for us and the changes we should make in our daily lives to help us grow closer to Him.

Eucharistic Miracles

Many Eucharistic Miracles revolve around someone having a crisis of faith (source) regarding the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist: the Catholic faith that we believe Our Lord is truly present, body, blood, soul, and divinity in the consecrated bread and wine of the Eucharist. In Blanot, France (March 31, 1331) the Eucharist fell out of a woman's mouth onto an altar rail cloth. The priest tried to recover the host, but all that remained was a large spot of blood the same size and dimensions as the host. In Bolsena-Orvieto, Italy, a priest had difficulties believing in the Real Presence, and blood began seeping out of the host upon consecration. Because of this miracle, Pope Urban IV commissioned the feast of Corpus Christi. In Lanciano, Italy (eighth century A.D.) a priest doubted the Real Presence, and when he consecrated the host, it transformed into flesh and blood. As some of our young people receive their First Holy Communion this Sunday, let us all remember who it is that we receive in the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

Peace and Hope in the Resurrection of Jesus

Christ's resurrection enables us to grow in peace because in the middle of this stormy, turbulent world, it gives us a firm anchor: our hope for life everlasting. We renew this hope every Sunday, when we pray the Creed. This has been exemplified through the centuries by the saints, and in a special way by the martyrs. St Ammon and his four companions were martyred back in the third century. They were Roman soldiers at the service of the Roman governor of the great city of Alexandria, in Egypt. Their martyrdom happened during the wave of persecution started by the emperor Decius, who forced all Christians to worship Roman gods under pain of death. Ammon and his companions, who were secretly Christians themselves, were on duty during a trial of prisoners accused of being Christians. The judge's interrogation was harsh and intimidating, and at least one poor Christian seemed to be wavering. The five soldiers saw what was happening and were afraid that their brother in Christ was going to deny his faith, thus putting at risk his eternal salvation. So they began to make encouraging signs to him, gesturing, nodding, bulging their eyes - anything they could do without putting themselves into too much danger. But their efforts were so energetic that the judge couldn't help but notice. And when he inquired as to what was going on, the five soldiers broke ranks and declared themselves Christians. This disturbed the Roman officials and caused quite a ruckus, but it also renewed the courage of the prisoners. In the end, both the prisoners and the Christian soldiers stayed faithful to Christ, suffering martyrdom instead of denying their Lord. The stormy persecution didn't steal their interior peace and lead them astray, because their anchor was firmly attached to the risen Lord.
