The Feast of Corpus Christi, also known as the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, is a Roman Catholic, Anglican, and Western Orthodox liturgical solemnity celebrating the Real Presence of the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the elements of the Eucharist.

**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection**  
**June 6, 2021 —**

The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ  
 Today we celebrate Corpus Christi — the Body and Blood of Christ. Jesus' Body and Blood was sacrificed for us on Calvary, but before that excruciating event, He humbly bound Himself to human hands in the Eucharist. As St. Thomas Aquinas expresses, "In this sacrament sins are purged away, virtues are increased, the soul satiated with an abundance of every spiritual gift. No other sacrament is so beneficial."  
 Our Gospel today recounts the Last Supper. As Jesus ate the Passover meal with His apostles, He broke bread, telling them, "This is my Body," and again, poured wine, saying, "This is my Blood... which will be shed for many." In this moment, Jesus sacrificially gave us Himself in the Eucharist by foreshadowing His passion, death and resurrection.  
 Out of total love, Jesus holds nothing back from us. He gives us His entire self.  
 We must ask ourselves; do we understand Who we consume at every Mass? It is our Precious Redeemer.  
 As life becomes busy and our minds are filled with the countless things we must get done each day, we often forget to acknowledge our Savior at Mass; or to spend time with Him throughout our week; or to accept all the graces He wishes to bestow on us as we receive Him. So let us stop and recognize the real presence of our Savior.  
 Jesus gave us the perfect and loving Gift of Himself so that we might be nourished, strengthened and more fully united to Him as we journey to eternal life. Let us strive to intentionally honor and reverence Him at every Mass; strive to fully partake in each Eucharistic meal; and let us find time to visit our Savior in the Tabernacle.

**Holy Smokes; Why do Catholics use incense**  
 God commanded how the incense should be made, a "holy recipe": And the Lord said to Moses, "Take sweet spices, stacte, and onycha, and galbanum, sweet spices with pure frankincense (of each shall there be an equal part), and make an incense blended as by the perfumer, seasoned with salt, pure and holy;  
 A ritual cleansing and purification of the sacred space of the Tabernacle, making it a worthy place for the worship of God - according to His terms. In fact, frankincense, mentioned in the Bible, is now known to have antiseptic and disinfectant properties.[S.catholic.org](http://S.catholic.org)

**Proper Disposition for Receiving Holy Communion**  
 In regards to receiving Holy Communion the Catechism states, "Anyone who desires to receive Christ in the Eucharistic communion must be in the state of grace. Anyone aware of having sinned mortally must not receive communion without have received absolution in the sacrament of penance" (CCC 1415). St. Paul states, "Whoever, therefore, eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of profaning the body and blood of the Lord. Let a man examine himself, and so eat of the bread and drink of the cup. For anyone who eats and drinks without discerning the body eats and drinks judgment upon himself" (1 Cor. 11:27-29). Therefore, if one knowingly receives Holy Communion in a state of mortal sin, they still receive the Body, Blood, Soul & Divinity of Christ, but they do not receive His grace and they also commit a grave sin of sacrilege as St. Paul points out. Therefore, if anyone knows themselves to be in a state of grave sin, they should refrain from receiving the Eucharist until they can receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

**Do You Believe?**  
 The Council of Trent (1545 to 1563), whose teaching has not been abrogated by any subsequent council, declared that we must honor Our Lord Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist publicly so that those who observe the faith of Catholics in the Most Holy Eucharist might be attracted to the Eucharistic Lord and believe in the Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, present in this great Sacrament. "The Catholic Church teaches that in the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of the God-man are really, truly, substantially, and abidingly present together with His soul and divinity by reason of the Transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. This takes place in the unbloody sacrifice of the Mass." We have to ask ourselves, if the way we approach the Holy Eucharist in Holy Communion or in Adoration was observed by a non-Catholic would they be moved to believe, would they be convinced in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ? And if not, then do we truly believe? Because our actions often reflect/reveal what we believe. If we truly believe then let us act in accord by showing due reverence to Jesus Christ present in the Eucharist.
