Stewardship Bulletin Reflection
August 22, 2021
Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary time

Our readings offer us examples of how we should be living, and they present us with an opportunity to make a radical change in our lives.

In our first reading, Joshua tells the leaders of the Israelites to decide as to who they shall serve in this life. As he presents them with this choice, he boldly states, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." Who or what does your household serve? Whether you are a household of one or twelve, now is the time to decide, 'will we serve the Lord?'

We are constantly bombarded with endless distractions around us. It can be very easy to serve other 'gods' in our lives. For instance, putting technology (phone, internet, TV), kids' extracurricular activities, our jobs, or our social lives before the Lord. We also might be putting these things above our loved ones, and if we are doing that, then we are putting them above our relationship with God.

With this in mind, we must strive each day to intentionally live as disciples of Christ. It starts with commitment — incorporating personal daily prayer and increasing that prayer week by week, incorporating prayer into our marriages and families, frequenting the sacraments, and serving others. Through this time with the Lord and service to those around us, He will reveal to us where to go next.

Reflect on how you may not be putting God first in your life and decide to respond like the Israelites, "Far be it from us to forsake the Lord for the service of other gods... Therefore we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God."

Don't Walk Away, But Return

"As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied Him." (Jn. 6:66) The "this" that is being referred to is Jesus' Bread of Life discourse, His teaching on the Sacrament of the Eucharist, where He tells His disciples that the Eucharist is His Flesh and Blood. And as a result of this teaching many of His disciples walk away, no longer follow Him. It is this reaction and Jesus' response that is one of the greatest proofs that the Eucharist truly is the Flesh and Blood of Jesus because He allows them to walk away, He does not stop them. IF Jesus had been speaking figuratively and they understood Him literally, He would have stopped them and corrected them, because He wouldn't want to lose anyone over a misunderstanding. BUT He didn't stop them because He was speaking literally and they correctly understood Him literally. There was nothing for Him to correct in their understanding. Further proof is that elsewhere in the gospels when the disciples did not correctly understand Him, He was quick to correct them.

When He told Nicodemus that one must be "born again" Nicodemus questions how can one re-enter their mother's womb, he is thinking of natural birth, but Jesus corrects by saying, "born of water and Spirit". When He is told that Lazarus has "fallen asleep" His disciples question why must they return to Bethany, if Lazarus is asleep He will wake-up, they are thinking in terms of a nap, but Jesus tells them, "Lazarus is dead." Never did Jesus want anyone to leave Him over a misunderstanding. It is the Eucharist that truly is the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ that we must eat in order to inherit Eternal Life, but is this a Truth that we have truly accepted or have we allowed ourselves to "walk away".
