**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection**  
NOVEMBER 7, 2021 —  
THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today's First Reading from the First Book of Kings, as well as the Gospel passage from Mark, both center on the actions of two seemingly poor and helpless widows who show themselves to be faith-filled and generous stewards.

In the eyes of the world, particularly in biblical times when there was no life insurance or Social Security, these widows were weak and dependent on others to take care of them. They each found themselves in desperate situations — one in the midst of famine with a child for which to care, and the other clearly impoverished. Yet, each demonstrated strength and generosity that distinguished them from those around them. From where did this strength come? It came from knowing who they are, and Whose they are. These women must have known their security would not come from a good life insurance policy or connections to someone with a hidden storehouse of flour. No, their security came from knowing they were daughters of the Most High God and from putting their faith in Him. They had no need to panic in the midst of natural disaster or cling desperately to their menial resources. Their faith in God set them free to trust Him when all seemed hopeless. Their faith kept them detached from material possessions. Their faith allowed them to be brave and generous, to think of others despite their own trials.

These women saw themselves as stewards, not owners, of the resources God gave them, regardless of how much or how little they had. And acting as stewards made them gracious, generous and mighty indeed.

**Stewardship Renewal: Given**

"Why do we have to fill out a form?" If we look at things logically, we realize that whenever we put things in writing and put our name to a form, the chances are we are going to fulfill it. If we just "promise" to do something we can always rationalize away the promise very quickly for all kinds of different reasons. If we have that form, we know what we have committed and are expected to follow through."--Msgr Thomas McGread. This month of November within our Diocese is known as "Stewardship Renewal Month", a time that as we come to the close of one liturgical year and the beginning of another, that we should reflect upon our life of stewardship over the past year and consider where we many need to make changes/improvements in the forthcoming year. So in this weekend's bulletin there is an insert you will find entitled, "My Personal Plan to Become Fully Alive as A Missionary Disciple", for you to use as a guide to help you reflect upon stewardship within your life. For those who have left their uniform hanging in the past, who move with difficulty, who reflect with a distant gaze upon times better unknown, we ask you to send these veterans comfort and peace. May they live long as examples of courage and faith, and may they inspire their children and grandchildren to stand ready to defend our Constitution, our God-given rights, and our faith. May you raise up all our dear veterans in the palm of your hand, and bless them. Amen.
