**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection**

NOVEMBER 14, 2021 —

**THIRTY-THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

Today's readings are in stark contrast to the joy of the holiday season that is fast approaching, warning us instead of dark times ahead and our inevitable judgment day.

The first reading from the prophet Daniel describes a time "unsurpassed in distress since nations began" and warns that "many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake; some shall live forever, and others shall be an everlasting horror and disgrace."

The second reading, from Hebrews, speaks of Christ who "waits until his enemies are made his footstool."

However, when we firmly establish for ourselves as individuals — as a family and as a parish that we will give to God the first and best portion of our Time, Talent, and Treasure — the warnings we read in the Scriptures today should be no cause for alarm. In fact, we can view these words as encouragement "Keep Calm and Steward On," no matter what comes our way. One of the blessings of a stewardship way of life is that in challenging times, whether in our homes or workplaces or even our beloved Church itself, we can take great comfort in knowing we have a concrete plan to keep our priorities in proper order. And, when we put God first in all aspects of our lives, we will experience the peace that He gives that surpasses all understanding.

**Value Them Both: What Kind of Protections Are at Stake?**

- 1) Parental notification: Pregnant teenage girls need advice from their loving moms and pediatricians, not traveling abortionists. Value Them Both guarantees parents, not strangers, guide their daughters.
- 2) Clinic and Abortionists Licensing: The abortion industry fights all efforts to hold them to even the most basic health and safety standards and can't be trusted. An abortionist in Kansas ran surgical instruments through a kitchen dishwasher and performed abortions in a carpeted office. No matter what choice a woman makes, she at the very least deserves to know the history of her doctor and that she will receive care from a trained medical professional, not a back-alley, traveling abortionist. Value Them Both helps prevent such medical abuse of women.
- 3) Restrictions on abortions in the second and third trimester: Abortions can and do happen late into pregnancies using more and more brutal methods. Value Them Both can open the door for laws to go into effect that ban things like live dismemberment abortions. We run the risk of Kansas allowing the use of tax dollars to perform abortion on healthy babies up to the moment of birth.
- 4) Informed Consent: Every woman has the right to know who is going to perform surgery on her and the risks involved. Value Them Both respects informed consent

**Stewardship Renewal: Given**

Inserted in this weekend's bulletin is a form entitled "Stewardship Way of Life 2021". As with last weeks form, this one provides an opportunity to reflect upon how we have been sharing our talents within the parish and where God might be calling us to do so in a new way. I would encourage everyone to fill out this form and return to the parish office. Not only does it help us to continue to grow and support our various ministries within our parish, but it also helps us update our parishioner database with correct contact information so as to improve communication. **Stewardship of Time**

People often say: "Time is money". This statement is not quite right. Time is much more valuable than money! We all have had the experience of wasting money on poor purchases and can usually recover from that, but not so with time. Time once spent can never be recovered. Every hour is precious. At every moment, we need to make sure that we take care of things that matter. Stewardship of time requires us to look at our lives as an opportunity to serve the Lord and to build up his Kingdom. It acknowledges that time is a gift from God and sets a portion daily to give God thanks. There are 24 hours in a day and we spend much of our time working, in order to provide the material needs for our family and others. We also spend time resting and refreshing our body and spirit through recreation and social events. It is important to spend time on all of these things but don't forget to spend time with God, through worship and doing the Lord's work. If you already tithe 10% of your treasure to the Lord and His works, consider using the same calculation to set aside time to worship God and to do His work. For Catholics, the weekly priority must be, first and foremost, to attend Sunday Mass. Stewardship of time is very important, if not the most important among the three categories. All believers — children and adults, men and women, single and married — are called to be responsible with their gifts of time.

**2022 Contribution Envelopes**

The 2022 contribution envelopes will be distributed differently than in the previous years. The envelopes will be mailed to parishioners quarterly. This is a more expensive alternative, but is due to the difficulty with distribution while we are in the gym. We have ordered envelopes for those who seem to use them regularly. We did not order for those who contribute through ACH or other methods.

You should receive envelopes for the first quarter by the last week of December. If you want the envelopes and did not receive them, please call the parish office. We will order them for the following quarters. If you receive them and do not need them because you are changing to ACH or some other reason, please call the office, we will cancel for the following quarters.

It is still perfectly fine to put a loose check in the collection, bring directly to the office, place cash or check in some other envelope or whatever method you prefer to make contributions.
