**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection**  
January 23, 2022 –  
Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

In St. Paul's letter to the Corinthians, it states "If they were all one part, where would the body be? But as it is there are many parts, yet one body" (1 COR 12:18-20).  
What does this teach us as Christian stewards? It shows us that we all have equal dignity and worth in God's sight, and that if God sees us as equally precious, we should view each other in this same light. It teaches us to humbly recognize our own gifts as well as the giftedness of every member of our parish family. And, while God designed us to be ultimately dependent on Him, it seems He has also designed us to need each other!

This is part of the beauty and richness of a stewardship way of life. No one person can "do it all" in life — whether in family life or parish life. But God does not ask us to do it all. He simply asks us to share the gifts and talents we do have in the season of life we find ourselves right now. It might feel uncomfortable at first. But the good news is you don't have to do it all. **Praying with Scripture**  
Here is a short 4 step process for the practice of Lectio Divina (praying with Scripture):

- 1) **Lectio:** Read the passage carefully, getting the sequence and detail without thinking too much about the meaning. Imagine the time of day, season of the year, smells of the land, sounds of the countryside, the human touches—all the elements that would make this scene real to you. Transport yourself into the setting using your imagination.
- 2) **Meditatio:** Read the scripture again. Why is there a record of this particular event or saying? What is the significance of this passage in the large scheme of things? What does this piece mean? How does that affect an understanding of God? Of conduct? Do you see yourself in any of the characters in the passage?
- 3) **Oratio:** Allow your feelings to surface as you read the passage again. Do you feel happy, sad, angry, or guilty? Silently or verbally talk this through with God; tell God what you feel about what you have read. Comment in your prayer on anything in the passage to which you respond.
- 4) **Contemplatio:** Sit quietly, breathe deeply and regularly, and let your mind go blank. As you quiet your inner self, simply listen in your heart. If you receive some impression or thought, quietly notice it; then focus your attention on remaining open. If you have no thoughts or impressions, return your mind to the scripture passage. After a while, open your eyes rested.

**Sowing Division or Unity**  
These were a series of wars between the ancient Roman Republic and a North African Kingdom called Carthage. After 100 years, Rome finally conquered Carthage. To keep Carthage from rising again, they sowed salt in all the farmland within a fifty-mile radius of the city.  
Sowing salt in soil makes it almost completely infertile. Good soil needs a certain amount of salts to be healthy, but salts are ions. So when soil is overloaded with salt, the soil - in order to neutralize these ions - actually sucks moisture out of the plant, instead of the other way around. In salted soil, then, the plant may be rooted in moist and nutritious soil, but it can't absorb any water.  
The salt separates it from its most essential nutrient. The Devil is in the business of sowing salt in the soil of our families, our church, our community - the whole human family. He doesn't want us to raise the crop of fruitfulness, peace, and spiritual maturity we are meant to.  
He sows selfishness and suspicion and envy and anger and all the other kinds of spiritual ions that drain out the lifeblood of human happiness - trust, self-sacrifice, forgiveness, kindness, patience, etc. Division is the Devil's work, but reconciliation and communion are Christ's work.  
If we want to be the Devil's disciples and experience frustration, all we have to do is sow division.  
If we want to be Christ's disciples and experience lasting (and everlasting) satisfaction, we need to be builders of unity.
