Sacred Triduum
 The word "Triduum" comes from the Latin word meaning "three days," and encompasses the three most sacred days in the Church year. It begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil, and concludes with evening prayer at sundown on Easter Sunday. The liturgical celebrations during the Triduum on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, the Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday are rich with symbolism and flow from one to another in a seamless way. While it may appear as if these liturgies are separate and distinct, they are actually intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all of the liturgies.

"Ok, hand it over." "Hand what over?" "The thing the Master needs." "What Master and what thing?" "You know, THE Master and THE thing. He said you would have something that he needs for the thing he is doing." "Ohhh, well, I'm going to use it for something else, sorry. The master can have it when I'm done with it." Brothers and sisters, what is the thing the Master has need of from you? Jesus didn't ask Simon of Cyrene to help carry his cross, but he carried it anyway. Jesus wasn't the one that asked for the donkey or colt to ride on into Jerusalem, but the owners gave it anyway. We needn't wait for Jesus to ask us personally for the gifts God has given us to use for his kingdom—the Church is asking, and the Church needs what you have to give! Let's pray we are never put to the test as Jesus commanded his Apostles, instead, let us pray that we can test out our gifts for God's kingdom because the Master has need of them.

Remember to Fast and Abstain
 Good Friday is an obligatory day of universal fast and abstinence. Fasting is obligatory for all who have completed their 18th year and have not yet reached their 60th year. Fasting allows a person to eat one full meal. Two smaller meals may be taken, not to equal one full meal. Abstinence (from meat) is obligatory for all who have reached their 14th year.

Why are you carrying around tree branches?
 Sometimes, one of the hardest things to explain as a Catholic is our attachment to symbolism. Palm Sunday is a great example of that. We come home from Mass holding palm branches, and we tuck them behind a crucifix or next to the picture of the Last Supper. To anyone who does not know our faith, it looks as though we stuck a few weeds on the wall... imagine their questions! The truth behind this tradition, however, goes to the story of Palm Sunday, when the people heard that Christ was coming and "they took out palm branches and went out to meet him, and cried out 'Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, [even] the king of Israel.'" (John 12:13). It was a tradition to spread palms before a king as he processed into his city. It was a way to welcome him, to show him glory and homage. Thus, Christ, the true King, was welcomed into Jerusalem. This fulfilled the prophecy in the Old Testament, which declared, "Behold: your king is coming to you, a just savior is he, humble and riding on a donkey." (Zech. 9:9) It revealed that Christ was a great king, but also a humble king. The people greeted him with wild joy and cheers of Hosanna. But one short week later, they crucified him. We celebrate this feast and carry palm branches home with us to commemorate the great humility of Our Lord, who loved us so much that he chose the cross for our salvation.

On Good Friday, let us remember the Passion of Jesus Christ and his loving sacrifice for us on the Cross. At three o'clock on a Friday, on a hillside called Calvary, the Savior of the world took his last breath. All for love of us.
