Stewardship Bulletin Reflection
 May 29, 2022 — The Ascension of the Lord

On this Feast of the Ascension, we celebrate Christ's triumphant return to the Father after perfectly accomplishing His mission on earth. But we also can also view this Feast as a celebration of the "launch day" of our commissioning as Christ's disciples. Today's Gospel draws our attention to the clear instructions that Jesus gave His disciples (and to us) just before ascending to the Father: "Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."
 Embracing a stewardship way of life, with its emphasis on the use of time, talent and treasure, helps us to live in such a way that our very lives speak as a witness of the Good News of the Gospel. While we take time to reflect and renew our commitments in these three areas annually as a parish family, it is of great benefit to take some time individually throughout the year to take stock of the commitments we have made — looking at both our strengths and our need for continued growth in each area. On this Feast of our "launch day," take some time to celebrate your victories as Christ's disciples and renew your commitment to remain faithful to Him and the unique mission He has entrusted to you!

A Coin Left:
 A coin left on a headstone or at the grave site is meant as a message to the deceased soldier's family that someone else has visited the grave to pay respect.

- Leaving a penny at the grave means simply that you visited.
- Leaving a nickel indicates that you and the deceased trained at boot camp together.
- Leaving a dime means you served together in some capacity.
- Leaving a quarter at the grave, you are telling the family that you were with the soldier when they were killed.

Memorial Day
 This Monday our nation will be celebrating Memorial Day, a day in which we remember and honor those men and women who died in service to our country while serving in the Armed Forces. On Memorial Day the Flag is raised briskly to the top of the staff and then solemnly lowered to the half-staff position, where it remains only until noon. It is then raised to full-staff for the remainder of the day. The half-staff position remembers the men and women who gave their lives in service of our country. At noon their memory is raised by the living, who resolve not to let their sacrifice be in vain, but to rise up in their stead and continue the fight for liberty and justice for all. Perhaps a question for reflection on this day is, do we live out our faith as a memorial day? We can see some similarities in regards to the celebration of the Mass. The Eucharist can be considered as a memorial sacrifice, one that not only remembers, but makes present (re-presents) the Sacrifice of Christ on the Cross—which is the ultimate laying down of one's life for another, namely for us. Do we let this ultimate price paid for us, given to us, resonate within our hearts and minds each day? And do we daily resolve to rise up and take full advantage of this great gift by living our lives in a Christian way?

Nine First Fridays Devotion to the Sacred Heart
 From the writings of St. Margaret Mary: "On Friday during Holy Communion, He said these words to His unworthy slave, if I mistake not: I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart that its all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on nine first Fridays of consecutive months the grace of final repentance; they will not die under my displeasure or without receiving their sacraments, my divine Heart making itself their assured refuge at the last moment." With regard to this promise it may be remarked:
 (1) that our Lord required Communion to be received on a particular day chosen by Him;
 (2) that the nine Fridays must be consecutive;
 (3) that they must be made in honor of His Sacred Heart, which means that those who make the nine Fridays must practice the devotion and must have a great love for our Lord;
 (4) that our Lord does not say that those who make the nine Fridays will be dispensed from any of their obligations or from exercising the vigilance necessary to lead a good life and overcome temptation; rather He implicitly promises abundant graces to those who make the nine Fridays to help them to carry out these obligations and persevere to the end;
 (5) that perseverance in receiving Holy Communion for nine consecutive First Fridays helps the faithful to acquire the habit of frequent Communion, which our Lord eagerly desires; and
 (6) that the practice of the nine Fridays is very pleasing to our Lord since He promises such great reward, and that all Catholics should endeavor to make the nine Fridays.
