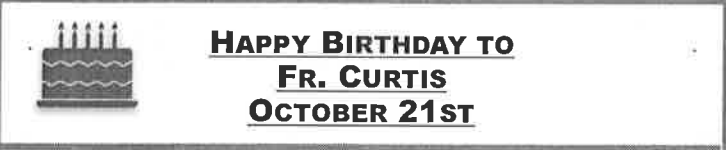

**Stewardship Bulletin Reflection**  
October 16, 2022 –  
Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The four pillars of parish stewardship are hospitality, prayer, formation, and service. Today's readings show us the immense value of prayer and the privileged place it must have in our individual lives and in our parish community.

Our Lord Himself calls us to prayer — and persistence in prayer — in the Gospel passage from Luke. Jesus tells the parable of the nagging widow who finally wears down the judge with her unrelenting persistence in her pursuit of a just ruling from him on her behalf. Jesus goes to great lengths to describe this judge, saying he "neither feared God nor respected any human." Yet even this corrupt judge responds with a just judgment because of the widow's persistence.

Jesus uses this outlandish example to draw a vivid contrast between a reluctant, dishonest judge and our loving, all-merciful Father. If even a bad judge will give a good result in response to a persistent request, how much more (infinitely more) eagerly and perfectly will our good Father respond to our persistent prayers to Him.

If he delays in responding, if he provides a different response from the one we were expecting, we can remain confident and trusting in His goodness, knowing that His response, whenever it comes and in whatever form, will be the very best one for us.

Our job then, as Christian stewards, is simply to remain faithful to our relationship with God through prayer. We must lean on each other in our communities — family and parish — as we support each other in prayer. A strong pillar of prayer will make all our other stewardship efforts fruitful.

**Our Lepanto is Now**

In 1571 Europe was facing invasion by the Islamic Ottoman Empire, whose stated purpose for invading Europe was to destroy and eliminate Christianity from the face of the earth, so as to spread the Islamic faith.

Unfortunately during this time many of the nations of Europe were busy fighting among themselves and showed little concern over this impending threat. One man that did take notice was St. Pope Pius V. He knew what a successful invasion by the Ottoman Empire would mean for the future of Europe and Christianity. So in response, he managed to assemble a make-shift navy, known as the Holy League, to engage the advancing Muslims.

This Holy League navy was smaller and less skilled in battle than the invading force and their chances of success were slim, which was something that the Pope realized himself. He knew they would not succeed on their own. So he called upon all Catholics to pray the rosary on Oct. 7th for the success of the battle. Churches in Rome were filled with the faithful praying their rosaries from dusk to dawn.

That same day the Battle of Lepanto took place. It lasted only 5 hours and many miraculous things happened during the battle that turned the tide in favor of the Christian fleet and brought them an overwhelming and decisive victory. In thanksgiving, St. Pope Pius V decreed that Oct. 7th be celebrated as the Feast of Our Lady of Victory, also referred to as Our Lady of the Rosary. Now as then, the Church, as well as our nation, is under attack by the forces of evil and we are in the midst of our own Lepanto. So too, it is the same call to arms, in the same way, that we the Catholic faithful need to respond, by taking up the spiritual weapon of the Rosary and praying for victory through our Blessed Mother's intercession.
