**Advance Stewardship Reflection
July 14, 2024
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Our readings today remind us to live our lives in total surrender to God's care.

The Gospel recounts when Jesus instructs His twelve apostles to begin their missionary work two by two. He encouraged them to take very little — a walking stick and sandals.

If you can recall a time you packed for a trip, or even left the house for a day's travel, you might remember making a list or packing days in advance. We tend to pack so we know we will be comfortable.

If we extend this concept of "comfort" into other areas of our lives, we will most likely find a few instances where we ensure life is comfortable. It could be buying extra food at the grocery store, making sure we have the most updated technology, or even feeling safe in our bank accounts.

It is not bad to have extra food in the pantry or a new phone. And it isn't bad to save money. These things can be good when used properly. But what if we are looking to these things for comfort, security or even happiness?

Imagine if Jesus approached you and said, "Go out and do my work, but you can only bring a walking stick and shoes." Would you be willing to surrender all the rest?

A key component of living out our call as Christian stewards is total surrender. It is trusting in God during our best moments and our hardest. It is looking to Him for security, comfort and happiness.

Reflect on the ways you might be looking for comfort in the things of this world. Tangibly find a way to become independent from that "thing" so that you can become more dependent on God.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus commissions His disciples with a profound mission: "As you go, make this proclamation: 'The Kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give" (Matthew 10:7-8). These words are a clarion call to us today, particularly in the context of spiritual renewal and the reawakening of faith. The physical acts of curing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing the lepers, and driving out demons symbolize the deeper, spiritual healing and restoration that Jesus offers. Many among us are spiritually sick, plagued by doubt, sin, and a sense of disconnection from God. Others feel dead inside, their faith extinguished by the trials of life. Some feel like lepers, isolated and stigmatized by their struggles and sins. There are those who are tormented by inner demons—fears, anxieties, and temptations—that distance them from God's love. Our mission, as followers of Christ, is to bring the light of His Kingdom into these dark places. We are called to reach out to those who have fallen away from the Catholic faith, to those who feel lost and abandoned. With compassion and love, we must extend the healing power of God's grace, helping them to rediscover the joy and peace that comes from a relationship with Christ. This task requires us to give freely of what we have received freely from God—His boundless mercy, love, and forgiveness. We do not bring people back to the faith by judgment or condemnation but by embodying the same unconditional love that Jesus shows us. By living as examples of His grace, we become instruments of His healing power. Let us remember that this calling is not only a duty but a privilege. As we reach out to heal, cleanse, and revive the spirits of those around us, we participate in the divine work of building the Kingdom of heaven here on earth. Through our acts of love and service, we proclaim that the Kingdom is indeed at hand, offering hope and new life to all who seek it.

May we always be mindful of this sacred mission, bringing God's healing and peace to every soul we encounter.

Prayer to Our Lady of Sorrows for the return of loved ones back to the Catholic Faith:

Sorrowful Mother, you who know the sufferings of a parent, please hear prayer. Mother whose heart was torn as a world of hate crucified Your Son, have pity on me and mine. Extend your hand in love and guidance to my loved ones, so that the path you walk together, will lead to a discovery of the fullness of Faith found only in the Eucharist. Help me to continue to love unconditionally, no matter what the circumstances. Amen.
