As we journey through this sacred season, our hearts are drawn to the profound mystery of the Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ. Where is Palm Sunday found in the Bible?

The account of Palm Sunday can be found in Matthew 21:1-11, Mark 11:1-11, Luke 19:28-44 and John 12:12-19.^{etwnews}

Palm Sunday is important to the Catholic Church because it marks the beginning of Holy Week, commemorating Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem, a pivotal event leading to his crucifixion and resurrection.

During Holy Week, a traditional way to pray the rosary is to focus on the Sorrowful Mysteries, reflecting on the suffering of Jesus and his Mother, Mary

Maundy Thursday is a solemn day observed particularly during Holy Week. It is a day that commemorates Jesus Christ's Last Supper with his disciples and reminds us of the importance of humility, selflessness, and service to others.

On its own, the word *maundy* means "the ceremony of washing the feet of the poor, especially commemorating Jesus's washing of his disciples' feet on Maundy Thursday."

What kind of palms are used for Palm Sunday?

Where do they come from?

Palm harvesters can be found around the world. However, a certain kind of palm tree grown in Florida called cabbage palmetto makes up a large majority of the palms used in U.S. parishes.

Why do we use palm branches on Palm Sunday?

The palm symbolized victory in the ancient world. All four Gospels tell us that people cut branches from palm trees and laid them across Jesus' path and waved them in the air as he entered Jerusalem triumphantly a week before his death. As the Church enters Holy Week, the faithful use palms to commemorate his victory and Jesus' passion liturgically.

On Palm Sunday the donkey itself is also interpreted as a sign of humility. In Christianity, this animal becomes almost a symbol of Christ himself, given how it patiently suffers and bears others' burdens. Horses tend to be associated with royalty.

In some places.. families would take their palms home and place one in the barn so their animals would be blessed, one in the house for further blessings, and one would be used as a means to sprinkle holy water.^{alena}

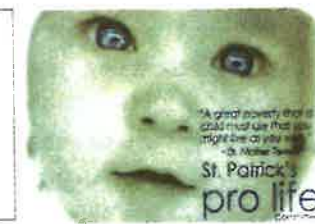
