Divine Mercy Sunday:
Living Mercy Through Stewardship

This weekend, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday, the Octave of Easter, when we contemplate the inexhaustible love and mercy of Christ poured out for us from His pierced side. In the face of our sin and frailty, Jesus does not turn away. Rather, He draws near, saying to each soul, "Peace be with you... Do not be afraid." In that beautiful image of the Divine Mercy—red and pale rays flowing from Christ's Heart—we see a call to respond. Mercy is never meant to be stagnant. It must flow outward, bearing fruit in how we live. The Diocese of Wichita beautifully expresses this call through our Stewardship Way of Life: "The grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God's gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor." This is more than a slogan. It is a spiritual roadmap. We are not passive recipients of grace. We are participants in God's mission of mercy. Just as the Apostles were sent forth from that upper room with power from on high, so are we sent to live mercy—to forgive, to heal, to serve, and to give generously of our time, talent, and treasure. Every hour we volunteer, every act of hospitality, every dollar shared in charity is a living echo of Christ's merciful Heart. This call to living mercy also lies at the heart of our Diocesan Capital Campaign, "One Family, Fully Alive in Christ." The campaign is not just about buildings or budgets—it is about strengthening the bonds of faith and mercy that unite us as a diocesan family. It is about ensuring that parishes like ours have the resources to welcome the lost, form disciples, support Catholic education, and care for the poor. When we support this campaign, we are extending Christ's mercy to future generations. We are saying: You belong. You are loved. You are part of this family. On this Divine Mercy Sunday, I ask you to pause and pray: "Lord Jesus, how would You have me respond to Your mercy?" Let us not keep that mercy to ourselves. Let us live it boldly—as stewards, as family, as disciples fully alive in Christ.

Five Reasons to Honor Mary During the Month of May

5. Mary is advocate, helper, benefactress and mediatrix. Her job, so to speak, began at the moment she conceived Jesus in her womb and continues until this day. What is more, it will continue for all eternity. As the first and most perfect disciple, she is devoted to accompanying him and continuing her saving office by interceding for us so that we may receive the gifts of eternal salvation. She is at work 24/7/365/forever, for whatever we need, whenever we need it. For all these reasons and more, Mary deserves honor, not only during the month of May, but always.
