**“One Family Fully Alive in Christ:
 Vocations and the Call to Shepherd”**


This Sunday, we celebrate Good Shepherd Sunday, a cherished moment in the Easter season when the Church turns our hearts to the image of Christ as the Shepherd who knows His sheep by name and lays down His life for them (John 10:11-18). It is no coincidence that this Sunday is also designated as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations—a day when the Church worldwide prays for men and women to respond to the call of Christ to serve as priests, deacons, and consecrated religious. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that His sheep hear His voice. But for many young people today, the noise of the world drowns out the still, small voice of the Shepherd calling them by name. The work of promoting and nurturing vocations is not merely a task for the priest or vocation director—it is a mission entrusted to the entire Church. Parents, teachers, parishioners, and mentors all play a role in helping others hear the voice of the Shepherd and discover their call. This is why our Diocesan Capital Campaign, “One Family Fully Alive in Christ,” is so critical. While the campaign will strengthen many aspects of our diocesan life, its heart beats most fervently for the promotion and support of vocations. Funds from the campaign will enhance the discernment of future priests and religious. We are not just raising money—we are planting seeds in the soil of future shepherds. In the Diocese of Wichita, we understand stewardship as “the grateful response of a Christian disciple who recognizes and receives God’s gifts and shares these gifts in love of God and neighbor.” Vocations are among the greatest gifts the Church can receive. They are the lifeblood of our parishes, our schools, our sacraments. Every priest was once a young man in a pew, uncertain, searching. Every religious sister was once a girl in a classroom, quietly listening for something more. Our stewardship —our grateful response—ensures that when the Good Shepherd calls, there is a community ready to support that response. This Sunday, let us pray boldly and generously for vocations. Let us give boldly and generously to support them. And let us remember that we are one family, united in Christ, fully alive when every member of the Body is empowered to respond to their calling—especially those whom God calls to be our future priests and shepherds. May the voice of the Good Shepherd be heard in every heart. And may our parish be a place where vocations are not only welcomed—but cultivated.
